What a wonderful fortnight it has been. It is great to see all our learners, particularly the youngest members of our community, settle into the rhythm of school.

We loved seeing so many families at our Welcome BBQ, Class Information sessions and Getting to Know You Yarns. Parents are their child's first teacher, and it is important for teachers to hear those valuable insights that you hold as they plan the year together with their students. We hope that these opportunities were just as worthless for you in meeting your child's teacher/s and the space where they will be working this year.

Latham Primary School is in its first year of being an Affiliated School with the University of Canberra. On Tuesday, we welcomed 25 preservice teachers and their tutor Michael to Latham Primary for their first Pedagogical Content Knowledge (PCK) class. This group of students will plan and deliver English workshops to students in Year 2 for the next 6 weeks. The university students start their class in our library together before moving out into classrooms to deliver lessons to students. Our year 2 teachers observe lessons and provide feedback to the preservice teachers.

Last week's workshops centred around getting to know students and gaining an insight into the where students are up to in their learning and perceptions around the subject area English generally. Throughout the year we will have more preservice teachers joining us for various placements as a part of their studies. These placements see teachers and preservice teachers working together to plan, deliver and evaluate learning for students.

Hosting preservice teachers is a valuable part of the work that we do as teachers in schools. As all of us once where nervously walking into a school and standing in front of a class for the first time as we began our practical learning through our university studies. As lifelong learners, we can also take time to reflect on practice and current teaching taking place in university today.

Reading is a powerful skill that we use in every day. Watching a child learn to read is a magical experience as they unlock a whole world of wonder and excitement. This process begins as young children recognises signs and symbols around them as they go about their daily lives. They cuddle up with a book as their trusted adult helps them to unlock some of that magic as they drift off to sleep. They begin to recognise letters and that those letters make sounds. All of this begins before they even come to school. As children get older and their skills develop further their reading menu becomes more diverse, as does their vocabulary. This knowledge begins to transfer into their writing.

Daily reading is an extremely important part of a child's journey as a reader. Research shows that reading 15 minutes daily exposes a child to over a million words over the course of a year.

There are different ways to engage in reading at home. You can:

- **Read to** your child. Choose books together and let them enjoy the experience of listening to stories and looking at pictures. Your child will bring home quality picture books each week as part of the Reading at Home program which you can share with them.
- **Read with** your child. (you might read with your voices together, or take turns with pages)
- Listen to books read **by** your child.

Stay tuned for some drop-in sessions and resources to support your child's reading development at home. Have a wonderful fortnight,


## Exciting Moments from the Past Fortnight!

## **ANNIVERSARY OF THE APOLOGY**

On the 13th of February, 2008, Kevin Rudd (Prime Minister of Australia at the time) apologised to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples for the atrocities of past governments. In year 2, we reflected on what the stolen generations are and why Kevin Rudd apologised. The students spoke about how it all made them feel and asked many questions.



NAPLAN testing will occur in our school between **13 and 25 March 2024** for students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9.

Online NAPLAN tests provide more precise results and are engaging for students. The tests are tailored (or adaptive), which means that each test presents questions that may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses. This helps students remain engaged with the assessment.

Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway.

All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

NAPLAN provides valuable information to schools and parents about literacy and numeracy achievement. It supports school improvement processes by enabling teachers to monitor student progress over time and to identify areas of strength and development.

All eligible students are encouraged and supported to participate in NAPLAN testing. Visit <u>www.nap.edu.au</u> to see interactive versions of the test and for more information.






