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PE/Health

Students will be learning a variety of Fundamental Movement Skills this term. Learning how to safely and accurately move their bodies through locomotor skills like running, jumping and skipping.

As part of Health, students will learn the importance of healthy eating, food products and describe how emotional responses affect their own and others' feelings.

HASS & Technology

In science students will investigate how materials have different properties and how they can be changed through hands-on activities. The students will use their knowledge to design food carriers.

The HASS/Technology unit 'FarmToTable' allows students to explore how farms and faamers are important people in our communities, how the students are connected at local and national scales, the processes of familiar products, and how changes in technology have impacted farming practices.

Visual Arts

Students will create a variety of artworks using a range of materials and techniques relating to special days, maths concepts, farm to table lessons and connection to places. The use of line, colour, shape and perspective are elements that the students we understand and apply during lessons.

Students will explore and write:

- Recounts of personal events
- Narratives changing the characters/settings of familiar stories'
- Advertisements persuading people to buy products
- Explanations and multimodal texts of the processes of plant and animal products.

The Resilience Project (TRP) lessons focus on the following concepts this term:
